Arctic Youth Photography on display in Coquitlam, BC

After a summer-long stay at the ArtStarts in Schools gallery in downtown Vancouver, the youth-driven photography exhibit *This Is Our Arctic* is now on display at libraries in Coquitlam, BC.

The photography exhibit, which showcases images of climate change captured by youth in Old Crow and Inuvik, has so far been on display in Whitehorse, Inuvik, and downtown Vancouver. Now, the photographs will be on display to audiences in Coquitlam for the rest of October.

Amelia Gabbott is the Library Technician for Information Services at the Coquitlam Library who was in charge of setting up the exhibit.

“The photographs are wonderful!” she said upon receiving the exhibit. “I am very excited for the residents of Coquitlam, and our neighbouring communities, to have the chance to see the exhibit.”

The Old Crow photographs are on display at the Poirier Branch, which is located at 575 Poirier Street in Coquitlam. The Inuvik photographs are displayed at the City Centre Branch at 1169 Pinetree Way, Coquitlam.
